

Snow Cancels Campus Talk By Malcom X

The scheduled campus appearance of Malcolm X was cancelled Wednesday night due to bad weather that forced the Black Muslim leader to remain in Chicago.

He was to have spoken under the sponsorship of the Student Council on Civil Rights.

ROY WOODS, chairman of SCCR said he had received a telegram about 5 p.m. Wednesday from Malcolm X.

The Muslim "high priest" expressed regret at not being able to come, but said the snow conditions made it impossible for him to fly from Chicago. He said he was hopeful that he could be of some future use to students on campus.

Woods added that he had tried to contact Malcolm X at his Chicago hotel after receiving the telegram, but could not reach him. He said SCCR hoped to have Malcolm X at some future date; arrangements would be made later.

BESIDES speaking to the University, Malcolm X was scheduled

uled to give a press conference upon his arrival in Madison late Wednesday afternon. Radio and television station WKOW had planned to have the conference at Truax field.

Woods declared, "We would have had a great crowd for Malcolm X's talk." His appearance "was the biggest thing attempted (by SCCR) in the past few years in terms of generating interest on campus."

It was learned that Malcolm X had scheduled a television appearance in Chicago today, and the possibility of being stranded in Madison Wednesday night might have influenced his decision not to appear here.
