Kaminer is a founding editor of Israleft News Service which served (1970-1986) as one of the main sources on critical thinking and the activity of the peace movement in Israel. Kaminer served on the national steering committee of the Committee Against the War in Lebanon (CAWL) and is an activist in the Committee for Solidarity with Birzeit University.

In November, 1986, Kaminer participated in an Israeli peace delegation which met with PLO representatives in Romania. As a result, Kaminer, along with three other Israelis, Latif Dori, Yael Lotan and Eliezer Feiler, is presently under indictment for violating an amendment to Israel's "anti-terrorist" laws. The trial which is to continue on June 14, 1987 will center on the legality of the amendment designed to terminate an ongoing dialogue between members of the peace movement in Israel and legitimate representatives of the Palestinian people.
