
Dear Roger:

I am writing to refer to you an incident that took place at the Law School yesterday, September 7, 1994 involving first-year law student Brigid McGuire. That incident involved destruction of property at the Law School as well as the possible endangerment of other students, and should be investigated as a possible non-academic conduct violation.

Complaining of discrimination by the Law School on the basis of disability, Brigid McGuire used a power saw to cut out a section from a table to make room for her wheelchair in Professor Jane Schacter's Civil Procedure class which meets in Room 260 of the law building. Her actions were not only ill-advised, but dangerous. The facts of this situation and the history of Ms. McGuire's relationship with the Law School are explained in the enclosed letter from Assistant Dean Robert Corrales to Ms. McGuire following this event. As you will see, the Law School administration and faculty have exerted a great deal of effort on Ms. McGuire's behalf. It is because of this fact that I find Ms. McGuire's behavior most troubling.
